Preface

Iwi contains final statistics from the Census of Population and Dwellings held on 6 March 2001. It is one of a series of reports that provide detailed statistics on the characteristics of New Zealand's population, households and dwellings.

The information in this report covers a wide variety of demographic, social and economic characteristics of *iwi* in New Zealand. The tables in this report relate to the Māori descent census usually resident population count (ie people of Māori descent who normally live in New Zealand and who were in the country on census night). The *iwi* question is one of several census questions in which people may provide more than one response. The tables in this report refer to total *iwi* responses. This means that tables include individuals who indicated an *iwi* as their sole *iwi*, or as one of several *iwi*.

Statistics New Zealand makes census data available to a wide range of people. The data is important to planners and policy-makers, researchers, community groups and the general public. A range of information from the 2001 Census has been published and is available free on the Statistics New Zealand website. More information will continue to be published and made available free on the website throughout 2002. In addition to published statistical information, Statistics New Zealand can provide customised information to meet the specific needs of users on a cost recovery basis.

Statistics New Zealand acknowledges the contribution of New Zealanders in their overwhelming support of the 2001 Census, and of the large number of people involved in planning, collecting, processing and disseminating the information.

Confidentiality

The Statistics Act 1975 sets out strict requirements on Statistics New Zealand to protect the confidentiality of information obtained from respondents during the Census of Population and Dwellings and other surveys. Action is taken at every stage of the census to make sure that only authorised people work with individual returns, and then with only as much as they need to know for that stage of the process. All staff who work on the census and other surveys have signed a Declaration of Secrecy.

It is an offence for any staff member to break the statutory declarations of secrecy that they make, and there is a very long history and tradition of consistent performance with keeping confidences over many censuses. Such a record supports the high level of public trust in Statistics New Zealand, and has led to the high levels of response to the census by New Zealanders.

During the collection of documents, there were arrangements for forms to be collected in sealed envelopes, should that option be chosen by a household or person. The names and addresses of respondents were used to ensure that all forms were collected from a household and are not part of the final computerised information.

When the census paper forms have been processed, Statistics New Zealand continues to have clear, statutory obligations to maintain the confidentiality of the census data in its custody. The Statistics Act includes a section that overrides the legal investigative

powers of other government agencies to obtain information. In publishing statistical tables and other aggregated statistics from the census datasets, Statistics New Zealand employs measures such as random rounding to protect the confidentiality of individual information.

Random rounding

Since the 1981 Census, Statistics New Zealand has utilised a confidentiality assurance technique of randomly rounding census statistics to base three. This enables the greatest possible amount of census data to be released without compromising the privacy of individual responses.

Under the random rounding process, all table cell values, including row and column totals, are rounded as follows

1. Zero counts and counts which are already multiples of three are left unchanged.
2. Other counts are rounded to one or other of the two nearest multiples of three.

All rounding, including separate rounding of totals and sub-totals is carried out on the recorded results. The probabilities of rounding up or down are set so that the long run expected value equals the original count. For example, an original count of 17 would be rounded to 15 with a probability of 1/3 and rounded to 18 with a probability of 2/3, since $15 \times 1/3 + 18 \times 2/3 = 17$. The effect of this rounding on the accuracy of census statistics for practically any proposed use is insignificant.

Rounding procedures

On occasions, figures or percentages have been rounded off to the nearest unit or decimal point. This may result in a total disagreeing with the total of the individual items as shown in tables.

Calculation of ratios

Unless otherwise stated, the 'not stated' category has been excluded from the denominator in calculation of ratios and percentages.

Highlights

In recent censuses, those people who said that they were of Māori descent were asked to name their iwi. These highlights are based on the 10 iwi with the largest population counts at the 2001 Census (as shown in figure 1). Iwi population counts are based on total iwi responses. That is, they include all of the people who stated each iwi, whether as their only iwi or as one of several iwi. Where a person recorded more than one iwi, they were counted in each applicable group.

Membership of Iwi

The Māori descent population count in 2001 was 604,110. This represented 18 percent of the total census usually resident population count. The number of people of Māori descent living in New Zealand grew by 4 percent over the five years to 2001. Figure 1 shows the population counts for the 10 largest iwi. A total of 111,810 people (20 percent) of the Māori descent population did not know the name of their iwi, compared with 112,563 (21 percent) in 1996.

Ngāpuhi remained by far the largest iwi nationally, with 23 percent of the Māori descent population who stated an iwi indicating Ngāpuhi affiliation in 2001. Ngāti Porou and Ngāti Kahungunu were the next largest iwi and two of only three with more than 40,000 affiliates at the time

of the 2001 Census. Ngāi Tahu was the largest iwi in the South Island and the fourth largest overall with 39,180 recorded affiliates in the 2001 Census. No other South Island or Chatham Island iwi recorded a membership exceeding 2,300 in the 2001 Census.

As figure 1 shows, of the 10 largest iwi, Waikato recorded the greatest absolute and percentage increase in membership over the five years to the 2001 Census. In comparison, Ngāti Tūwharetoa recorded the smallest increase in membership over this period. The increase in Waikato affiliations resulted in it becoming the fifth largest iwi in 2001. In 1996, it ranked as the seventh largest iwi.

Of the Māori descent population who knew their iwi, 64 percent stated one iwi, 24 percent stated two iwi and 12 percent stated three or more iwi. Figure 2 compares the percentage that affiliated with a single iwi by the different regions throughout New Zealand. Out of all the regions, Bay of Plenty had the lowest percentage of single iwi responses (56 percent). People of Māori descent in the South Island were more likely than those in the North Island to give single iwi responses. The highest percentage of single iwi responses were recorded in the West Coast (78 percent) and Otago (77 percent) regions.

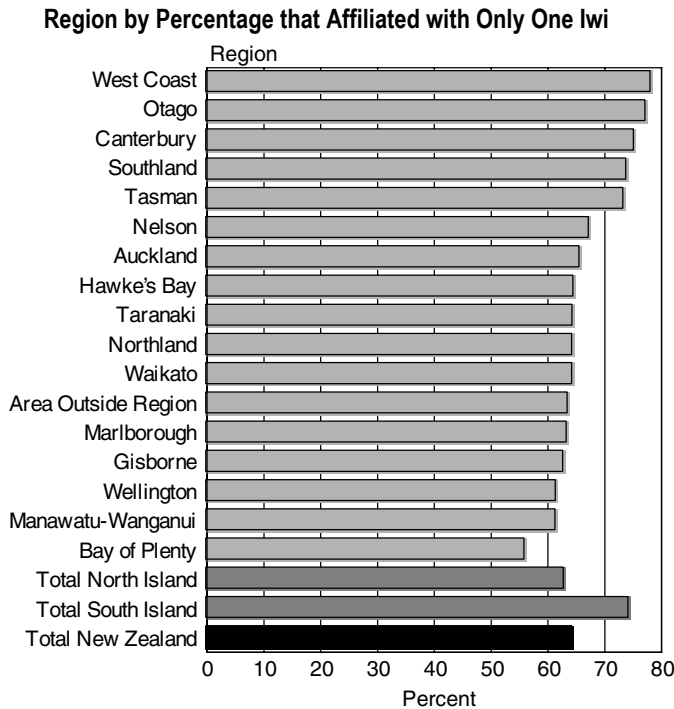

Age Distributions

In 2001, the median age of the total Māori descent population was 22.3 years. In general, the Māori descent population has a young population, with 37 percent aged less than 15 years. Only 3 percent of the population was aged 65 years and over.

Of the 10 largest iwi, Tūhoe and Ngāti Tūwharetoa had the youngest populations. Forty-two percent of Tūhoe and 40 percent of Ngāti Tūwharetoa were under the age of 15 years in 2001. By contrast, 35 percent of both Ngāi Tahu and Te Atiawa were in this age group. Of the 10 largest iwi, Ngāi Tahu and Te Atiawa (both 4 percent) also had the highest proportion of their iwi aged 65 years and over.

Te Reo Māori

Twenty-one percent of the Māori descent population (or 126,519 people) reported that they could have a conversation about a lot of everyday things in te reo Māori. In total, 5,241 (1 percent) of the Māori descent population count said that te reo Māori was the only language in which they could converse. A further 237 people could only converse in te reo Māori and another language other than English.

The percentage of each iwi that were able to converse in Māori varied considerably. Of the 10 largest iwi, Tūhoe (42 percent) and Ngāti Awa (36 percent) recorded the highest percentage of people who could

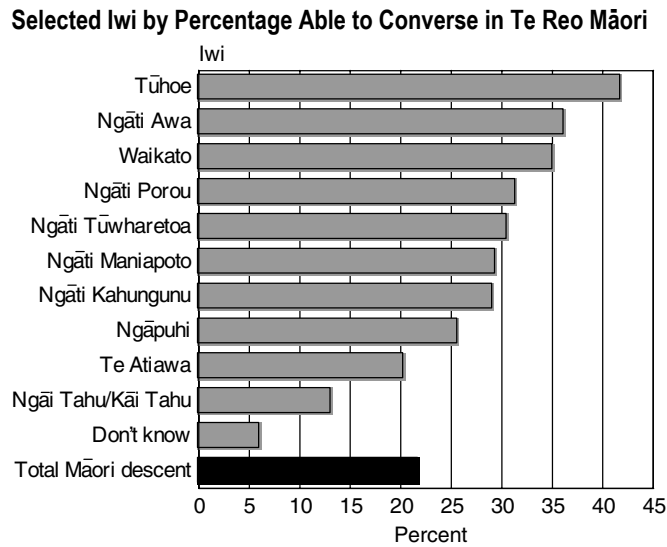
converse in te reo Māori. The ability to have a conversation about a lot of everyday things in te reo Māori was much lower among Ngāi Tahu (13 percent) and Te Atiawa (20 percent) members. Only 6 percent of Māori descendants who did not know their iwi were able to converse in te reo Māori. Figure 3 shows the percentage able to converse in te reo Māori for the 10 largest iwi.

Religion

Half of the Māori descent population reported an affiliation with a Christian religion at the 2001 Census. The two most common Christian denominations were Anglican (15 percent) and Catholic (14 percent). Ten percent of the Māori descendants stated an affiliation with a Christian Māori religion. The two most common Christian Māori religions were Ratana (8 percent) and Ringatū (2 percent). One-third of Māori descendants said they had no religion. Eight percent of Māori descendants objected to answering the religion question.

Of the 10 largest iwi, the highest proportions reporting an affiliation with a Christian religion were Ngāti Porou (57 percent), Ngāti Kahungunu and Te Atiawa (both 54 percent). The Anglican religion was most commonly reported by members of Ngāti Porou (26 percent) and Ngāti Kahungunu (19 percent) and the Catholic religion by Ngāti Tūwharetoa (18 percent) and Te Atiawa (17 percent).

Of the 10 largest iwi, Tūhoe (24 percent) and Ngāti Awa (22 percent) had the highest proportions affiliated to a Christian Māori religion. Ngāti Tūwharetoa (18 percent) and Ngāti Kahungunu (13 percent) had the highest proportions affiliated to the Ratana religion. Tūhoe (18 percent) and Ngāti Awa (16 percent) had the highest proportion affiliated to the Ringatū religion.

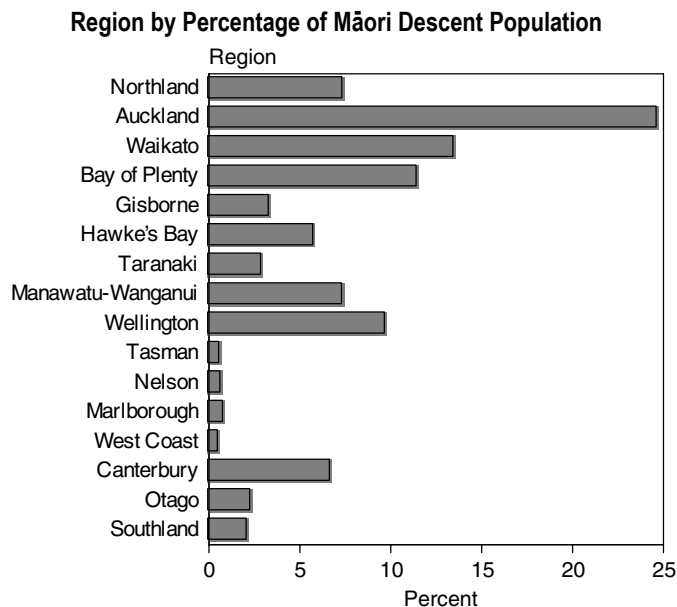
Regional, Urban and Rural Distribution

Twenty-five percent of the Māori descent population in 2001 resided in the Auckland region and 13 percent in

the Waikato region. In total, 86 percent of Māori descendants resided in the North Island. Figure 4 shows the percentage of the Māori descent population that resided in the various regions.

A low proportion of Ngāti Porou members (19 percent), an East Coast-based iwi, resided in the Gisborne region. In comparison, 62 percent of Ngāpuhi, a Northland-based iwi, resided in the Northland or Auckland regions. Fifty-six percent of Ngāi Tahu members, a South Island-based iwi, resided in the South Island.

Eighty-four percent of Māori descendants resided in an urban area at the 2001 Census. Of the Māori descendants who resided in an urban area, 77 percent were in a main urban area (main urban areas have a population of 30,000), 8 percent were in a secondary urban area (secondary urban areas have a population ranging between 10,000 and 29,999) and the rest were in a minor urban area (minor urban areas have a population ranging between 1,000 and 9,999).

Of the 10 largest iwi, the percentage that resided in an urban area ranged from 81 percent (Ngāti Awa and Tūhoe) to 88 percent (Te Atiawa). Iwi with a large percentage of their population in main urban areas included Ngāti Porou (70 percent), Ngāpuhi (68 percent) and Waikato (67 percent). Of the 10 largest iwi, Ngāti Awa were the least likely to reside in a main urban area (48 percent), but had the highest percentage of their population (18 percent) residing in a secondary urban area. There were no noticeable urban/rural differences between the total Māori descent population and those who did not know their iwi.

The Māori Ethnic Group and Māori Descent Populations

At the 2001 Census, the Māori descent population count was 604,110, which represented 18 percent of the total usually resident New Zealand population count. In comparison, 526,281 people reported that they belonged to the Māori ethnic group, which represented 15 percent of the total usually resident New Zealand population count. As figure 5 shows, of those who descended from a Māori, almost 1 in 5 (19 percent) did not identify as part of the Māori ethnic group. Conversely, 5,322 people stated that they did not descend from a Māori but identified as part of the Māori ethnic group.

Figure 6 shows that almost half (46 percent) of Māori descendants who did not know their iwi did not identify as part of the Māori ethnic group. In comparison, only 12 percent of Māori descendants who knew their iwi did not identify as part of the Māori ethnic group.

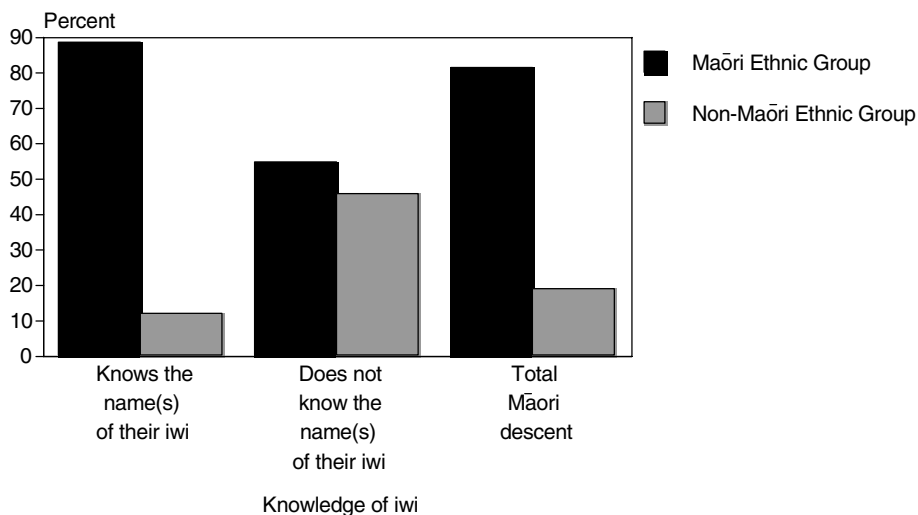

Of the 10 largest iwi, Tūhoe and Ngāti Tūwharetoa members were most likely to report that they belonged to the Māori ethnic group (95 percent). In comparison, Ngāi Tahu members (74 percent) were least likely to identify with the Māori ethnic group. Figure 7 shows the percentage of the 10 largest iwi who did and who did not identify as part of the Māori ethnic group.

Educational Qualifications

In 2001, 59 percent of the Māori descent population aged 15 years and over held a formal educational

qualification. Thirty-seven percent held a secondary school qualification as their highest educational qualification. A further 17 percent held a vocational qualification and 5 percent held a bachelor or higher degree as their highest educational qualification.

Of the 10 largest iwi, Ngāi Tahu and Te Atiawa had the highest percentage of members with a qualification (70 and 68 percent, respectively). As shown in figure 8, Ngāi Tahu also had the highest percentage with a secondary school qualification (40 percent), and a post school qualification (30 percent) as their highest educational qualification.

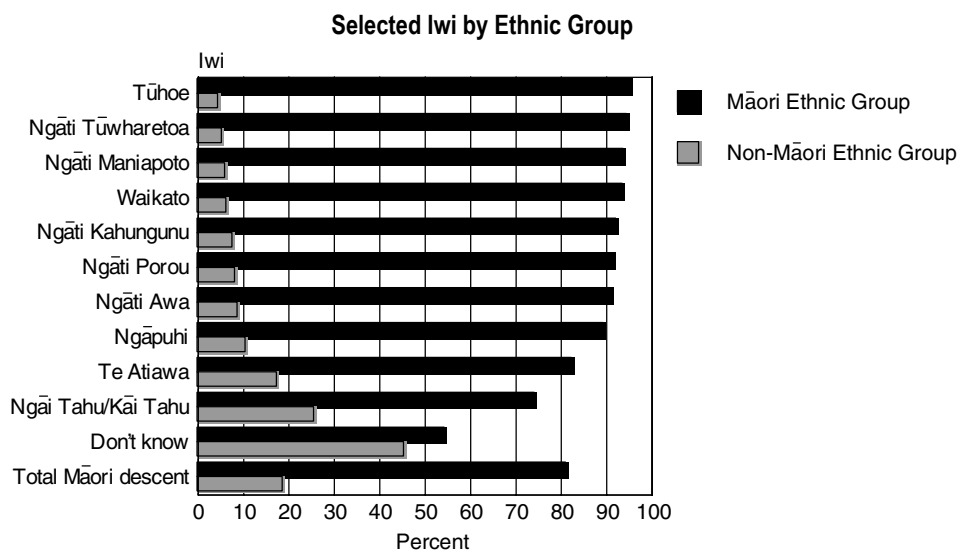
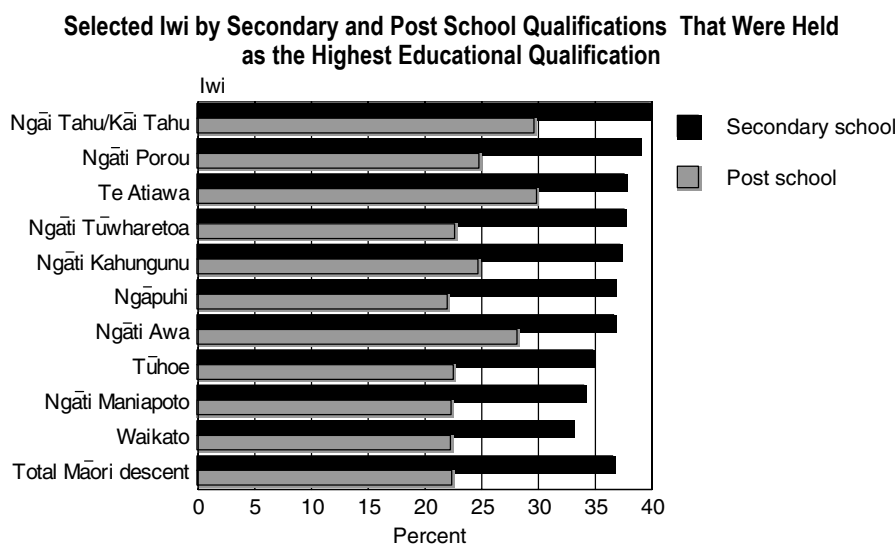

The Labour Force

At the 2001 Census, the labour force participation rate for the Māori descent population was 69 percent. This rate ranged from 68 percent (Ngāpuhi) to 72 percent (Ngāi Tahu) among the 10 largest iwi. Fifteen percent of Māori descendants in the labour force were unemployed – the rate of unemployment varied considerably among the 10 largest iwi from 10 percent (Ngāi Tahu) to 22 percent (Tūhoe).

Of the 85 percent of the labour force that were employed in 2001, almost 9 out of 10 (87 percent) reported their status as paid employees. A further 4 percent reported their employment status as employers, 7 percent as self-employed and without employees and 2 percent as an unpaid family worker. About 1 in 4 (24 percent) of those employed worked part time.

Of the 10 largest iwi, the percentage of employed people who reported their employment status as a paid employee ranged from 84 percent (Ngāi Tahu) to 91 percent (Tūhoe). The percentage in 2001 who were employers ranged from 2 percent (both Tūhoe and Waikato) to 5 percent (Ngāi Tahu), while those who were self-employed and without employees ranged from 4 percent (Tūhoe) to 9 percent (Ngāi Tahu). A similar percentage (2 or 3 percent) of each of the 10 largest iwi said their employment status was as an unpaid family worker in 2001.

Personal Income

In the year to March 2001, the median personal annual income for people of Māori descent aged 15 years and over was \$15,600. As figure 9 shows, the median annual income for the 10 largest iwi ranged from \$13,600 to \$16,800.

Sixty percent of Māori descendants aged 15 year and over received a payment (such as a wage or salary) from an employer in the 2001 Census. Other notable sources of personal income were the community wage–job seeker benefit (13 percent), the domestic purposes benefit (11 percent) and income received by way of interest, dividends, rent, or other investments (10 percent).

Of the 10 largest iwi, a higher percentage of Ngāi Tahu (66 percent) and Te Atiawa members (64 percent) stated a wage or a salary as a source of personal income. Members of these same two iwi were also more likely than those from other iwi to receive income from self-employment or a business (13 and 11 percent); interest, dividends, rent, or other investments (17 and 14 percent); and New Zealand superannuation or the veterans pension (both 7 percent). Similar proportions of members of each of the 10 largest iwi stated a student allowance as a source of income (4 to 5 percent). The proportions that reported no source of income were also similar (6 to 8 percent).

Home Ownership

Just over one-third (35 percent) of the Māori descent population aged 15 years and over stated that they either owned or partly owned their usual residence in 2001. Of the 10 largest iwi, Ngāi Tahu and Te Atiawa members were the most likely to either own or partly own their usual residence, at 45 percent and 39 percent respectively. Figure 10 shows that the percentage aged 15 and over that owned or partly owned their usual residence ranged from 27 percent (Tūhoe) to 45 percent (Ngāi Tahu).

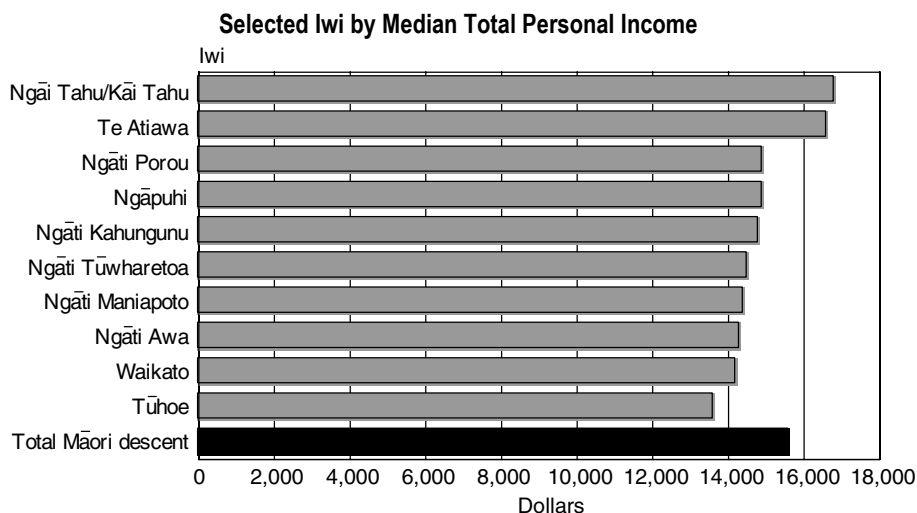
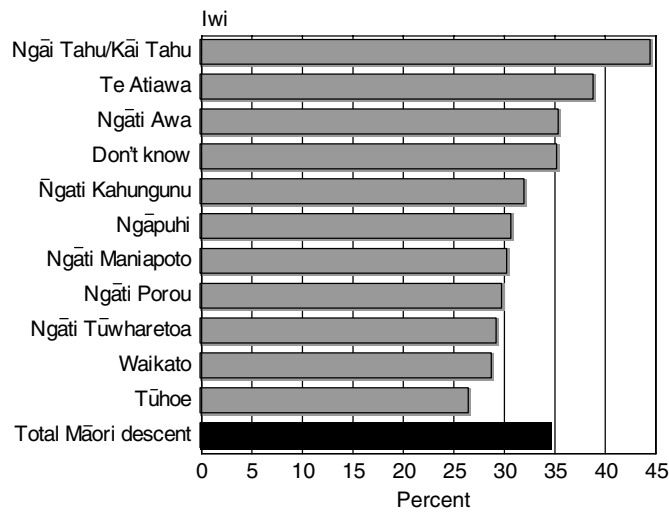

Access to Telecommunication Systems

Ninety percent of the Māori descent population resided in a household that had access to a telephone. Twenty-nine percent of Māori descendants resided in a household with Internet access and 18 percent had access to a fax machine. In total, 10 percent of the Māori descent population resided in a household that had no access to any telecommunications systems.

Of the 10 largest iwi, Ngāi Tahu and Te Atiawa recorded the largest percentage of people in households with access to the Internet (40 percent and 36 percent,

respectively) and to a fax machine (25 percent and 23 percent, respectively). Tūhoe had the lowest level of household access to a telephone (84 percent), the Internet (20 percent), and to a fax machine (12 percent).

Availability of a Motor Vehicle

Twelve percent of the Māori descent population resided in a household that had no motor vehicle available. As shown in figure 11, of the 10 largest iwi, the percentage that resided in a household that had no motor vehicle available ranged from 7 percent to 17 percent.

Selected Iwi by Percentage That Reside in a Household That Had No Motor Vehicle Available

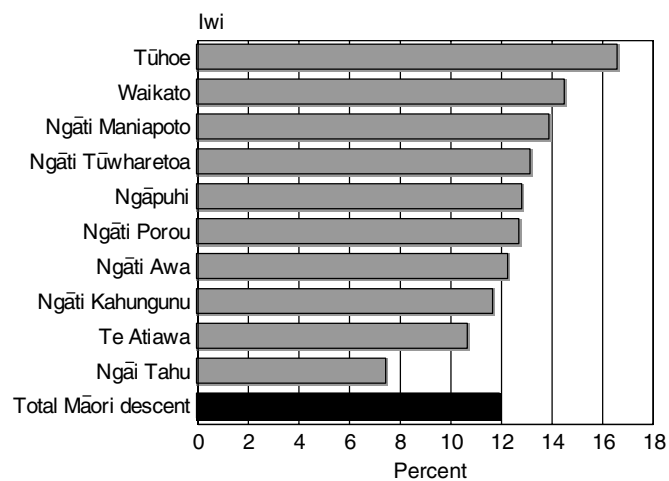

Explanatory notes

2001 Census Data Quality

For the 2001 Census of Population and Dwellings, Statistics New Zealand put in place a Quality Management Strategy (QMS) to ensure data from the census was fit for use. The QMS identified key actions Statistics New Zealand was to undertake during all phases of the 2001 Census cycle to ensure data quality.

At the processing phase of the census, certain quality assurance procedures were implemented to ensure that the data was recorded accurately and that any inconsistencies were minimised as the data was coded. These processes did not attempt to change the respondents' answers. The objective was to minimise introduced error in the data.

This strategy means that some inconsistencies may remain in the census data. There may, for example, be slight inconsistencies in table totals for some variables. These inconsistencies do not affect the fitness for use of data.

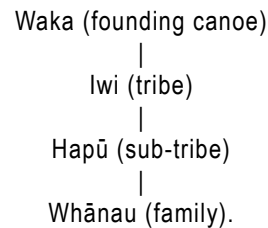

Māori Descent Versus Māori Ethnic Group

The subject population for the data in this report is, in most cases, the Māori descent census usually resident population count. This population differs from the population of the Māori ethnic group. Measures of descent are based on a biological concept, whereas the concept of ethnicity has a social and cultural base.

Iwi

The concept of iwi has changed over time. Today it is the focal economic and political unit of the traditional Māori descent and kinship based hierarchy of:



Iwi not named, but waka or iwi confederation known

In 2001, if a respondent named a waka or an iwi confederation, rather than an iwi, the response was output as part of an additional set of categories that have been added to the iwi classification under the heading 'iwi not named, but waka or confederation known'. These new categories provide a better description of particular groups of responses which had been included in various other parts of the iwi classification in 1991 and 1996.
