**Audio (child):** He aha tō pakeke, Nan? **Caption:** How old are you, Nan?

**Audio (Nan):** Pakeke ake au i a koe. **Caption:** A lot older than you!

**Audio (child):** Nui rawa tō nohonga ki te taha o tō kuia? **Caption:** Did you spend lots of time with your nan?

Audio (Nan): He wā poto taku nohonga ki te taha o tōku nei kuia. E mate ana e ia te wā e tamariki

ana ahau.

**Audio (voiceover, man's voice):** Pērā ki ngā mokopuna, kei te karanga tonu a Tatauranga Aotearoa i ngā pātai rawe.

**Audio (voiceover, man's voice):** Ko ngā hua e kohikohi e Tatauranga Aotearoa kia whakanui te hīnaki mō te iwi Māori mō āpōpō.
